Safety Drills

US Fire Administration (USFA) says that older adults face the greatest relative risk of a fire.

- Physical limitations and the decline of physical or mental capabilities can heighten the risk for older adults.
- Medication that affects alertness can compound the threat of danger.
- Cooking can be particularly dangerous because older adults may forget they are working around a stove or oven and become distracted. They may also rest for a minute, find a cozy couch or chair and fall asleep.

Knowledge and awareness are the keys to preventing fires. Take a proactive approach to home fire safety by learning about potential fire hazards and how to

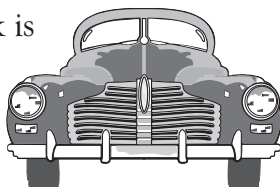

The Challenge

Strange Car

We keep car information in our database. If we see a car parked on our property that we do not recognize for more than a day or two, we will start to ask around about who the car belongs to. If needed, we will call the police. If you are having an overnight guest for more than a few days, it would be prudent to let us know. Ridge Oak is private property. No one can just park a car here on a whim.



Capital Projects Continue

Ridge Oak roof replacements continue. This work should wrap up over the next 8 weeks or so.

Laundry room renovations continue. Village 11 is in process. Village 7 will follow.

Village 12 common area HVAC replacement work is underway but is slow moving. It will be done before the snow flies.

Heating Up

The boiler pumps (that move hot water through the baseboards) in ALL villages will only turn ON when the outside temperature falls below 70 degrees. We cannot provide heat for those that feel a chill when it is 70 or above outside.

If you live in villages 1-11, before you call the office to complain, check the temperature outside and then “exercise” your thermostat. You need to turn the dial all the way up and down 6 or 7 times to get the mechanical valve inside the thermostat to open. Put it at the highest temperature, if after 30 minutes there is no change call us.

In Village 12, 1A and 9A turn your thermostat up or down to adjust the room temperature. Your thermostats are electronic and heat flow should simply adjust based upon the thermostat setting.

Election Day Made EASY

Election Day is Tuesday, November 5th. Felmeth Hall RB Boye Community Room is your polling place. You may vote either in person or by mail.



Too hard to get to Felmeth Hall to vote? Make it easy on yourself! ANYONE can vote by mail by completing Application for a Vote by Mail Ballot and returning it to the Somerset County Clerk. Application forms are available in Ridge Oak office. Completed forms must be received at the County Clerk's Office before October 29th.

You must be registered to vote. If you have moved or are not registered, you may register online or pick up a form at the Ridge Oak Office. The deadline for mailing your voter registration form is October 15th. Questions? Call Somerset County Clerk at 908-541-1289.

Clean Out

It is time to clear planting areas outside apartments and raised garden beds behind the barn. Cut back or pull out plants in the ground. Throw out dead summer plants in pots. If you planted or

potted it, clear it out! Please store planting items (including empty pots and gardening tools) indoors, not on your porch/patio. If any person does NOT clean out their assigned raised bed garden area, they will NOT be eligible for a raised bed garden next spring.

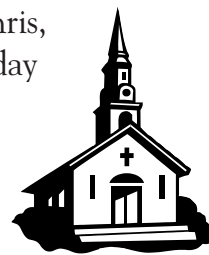
Housekeeping

Natirar is an estate spanning 491 acres in Peapack-Gladstone, Far Hills and Bedminster. Its name is a reverse spelling of Raritan. The complex was built between 1910 and 1912. In 2003 it was sold by the estate of Hassan II, late King of Morocco, to Somerset County, and is now administered by Somerset County Park Commission. Approximately 90 acres of the estate have been leased to develop that portion of the estate (which includes the mansion, stable/carriage barn and most of the other outbuildings) into an exclusive hotel, spa, restaurant complex.

Get your flu shot in Felmeth Hall RB Boye Community Room! The VNA of Somerset Hills will hold a flu clinic at Ridge Oak (for residents only) Wednesday, October 23rd from 9 am to 12 noon. The formula this year covers four different strains! There will not be any pneumonia vaccinations this year.

Medicare Part B covers the cost of the flu shot. If you have a Medicare HMO/ Medicare Advantage, you must pay \$25 for the flu shot. You must call the office to sign up for your flu shot. Bring your Medicare card with you to the clinic. If you forget your Medicare card, you will be sent home to get it and may lose your appointment slot. We cannot accommodate requests for specific appointment times! We schedule groups of ten residents every 15 minutes, you cannot be taken earlier than your scheduled appointment. If you need a ride on the transporter, please let us know.

Cara wanted to preserve her beloved home and wanted visitors to learn and share in the rich agricultural history of her farm and through living cultural programs, experience life in the late Victorian era. At this National Register Site visitors can churn butter, crack corn, feed the chickens. Meet up close our draft horses or watch the milking of a Jersey Dairy cow. Two dwellings are open for tours: A Gothic Revival mansion, The Willows and the first floor of the farmhouse restored to the period 1918-1927.

Admission is \$5. Sign-up is required. If you sign up and you cannot attend, you must cancel by 11 am on Monday, October 28th or you will be billed for

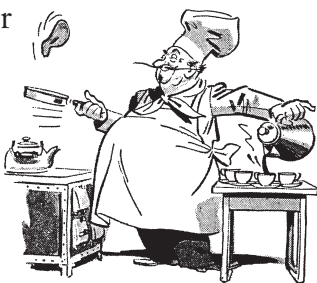
your spot. No refunds will be issued for no-shows. You will be billed for this activity in November.


















VNA Rummage Sale
